Headmistress's Letter

Dear Parents

This is the final Headmistress's letter of the academic year before we break for the summer. The last two weeks have been very busy indeed. We had a wonderful Summer Concert, with over thirty performances from soloists, ensembles and the sinfonietta and orchestra. Last week we have had an excellent Moving Up Day when pupils enjoyed spending time with their teachers for next year. The new Year 7 senior pupils also had an Induction Day meeting their form tutors, having some taster senior lessons and getting to know each other in a team building afternoon. The pupils joining after 13+ spent the day in school with their classes too. It was a super day and lovely to meet all our new pupils.

I am pleased that we have been able to run a number of trips over the last three weeks, which the pupils of all ages have enjoyed. Everyone in school has one final trip or event before the end of term; the Early Years classes have a special event in school, the juniors are going to Chessington and the seniors have their annual House Trip. We also have the whole school sponsored walk on Tuesday 10 July to look forward too.

Thank you for supporting the recent NSPA Summer Barbecue so enthusiastically. It was a lovely afternoon, characterised by a real sense of community and family fun. The Parents' Association worked extremely hard to pull it all together and I'm very grateful for all they did. The proceeds will all be going towards the iPad project.

Summer Heatwave

The heatwave is predicted to continue over the next week, with temperatures in the high twenties all week. Please continue to apply sun cream before school and to send your children in with water bottles. The gazebos in the playground will remain in place until the end of term to provide shade at break times.

Pupils may continue not to wear their ties and blazers in school this week. However, I do ask that all pupils come to Speech Day with their ties and blazers. They will be allowed to take their blazers off in the hall, but will wear them to collect prizes and for photographs. Likewise, please can the girls wear cool sensor navy tights for Speech Day if they are collecting a prize or performing.

Early Years Celebration on Monday 2 July

The Kindergarten and Reception children have been preparing for their End of Year Celebration, which took place on Monday at 2.00pm in the URC church in Buxton Road. The children were presented with their certificates of achievement after another very successful year for our youngest pupils.

Every pupil in Reception is either exceeding or has met every one of the areas of learning in the Early Years framework. This is a wonderful achievement for all of the children.

Speech Day on Thursday 5 July

As you know, school finishes after lunch at 2.00pm for all pupils from Year 1 upwards on Thursday. Kindergarten and Reception have school as usual in the afternoon with after school club, but there is no after school club on that day for any other year group.

Parents will have received a letter informing if your son or daughter is collecting a prize this year. A number of pupils are also performing in the evening. All parents and families are welcome to join us.

I do expect all pupils from Year 1 upwards to attend and parents should contact me if this presents a problem. We obviously hope that all prize-winners will be there to collect their prizes and to be photographed. You will be able to purchase photographs on the evening from DE Photos, or online afterwards.

I am delighted that Susanna Worth from United World Schools is our Guest of Honour this year.

The formalities begin at 6.00pm, so we request that all pupils arrive by 5.45pm so that they can be seated in the correct place either with the prize winners, performers or with their form group.

It is a formal event and so we expect all pupils to be looking their smartest in the summer uniform, which means school grey shorts and socks for boys up to Year 4 and summer dresses for girls up to Year 6. Hair should be tied back neatly. Senior girls should wear blue opaque tights, not socks, if they are collecting prizes, but juniors may wear white socks with their summer dresses.

All pupils should have their blazers with them, although they will only need to wear them when they come to collect a prize or to perform.

Pupils who are collecting prizes or performing will have a rehearsal on Thursday morning at the Assembly Hall from 11.00am, returning to school for lunch at 1.00pm. Members of staff will escort them to and from the venue.

Wednesday 11 July – Last Day of Term

As usual school will close at 12 noon for all pupils on the last day of term, following a whole school assembly when certificates will be presented and we will reflect on the year.

Pupils need to take home all of their belongings on or before the end of term. This includes seniors emptying their lockers and taking home all bags and PE kits.

Lost Property

Any items left in school after the end of term will be collected up by the caretakers and put into black sacks. We will attempt to return named items to pupils in September but if items are not reclaimed at the start of term, they will be recycled or donated to the Normanhurst School Parents Association.

End of Term Reports

Reports are going home for all pupils on Monday 9 July. We hope you find them informative and helpful. All pupils have progress targets on which to build next year. If your child is leaving Normanhurst this summer, please ensure you have downloaded the reports and any other information from the portal you would like to keep by the end of term.
