Mrs Asghar has extensive experience in teaching Science and a track record of helping pupils to make progress, achieving outstanding outcomes. This year we have started our 'gift a birthday book' scheme, where pupils on their birthday can gift one of their favourite books to the school. Please could I ask parents to encourage good road crossing habits. Although it may feel quicker to cross the road between cars, it is incredibly dangerous and not something we support as a school. There is a zebra crossing not too far from the school, which is much safer to use. Please support us in encouraging pupils to cross safely by discussing this with your child.

### **Winter Uniform Reminders**

We take great care to maintain high standards of uniform and presentation at school, and as we return to wintery weather I would like to remind you of the school's uniform expectations.

From November all pupils should be wearing the winter uniform. Juniors from Reception class upwards are expected to wear the regulation school coat purchased from the uniform shop.

Seniors must wear either the school coat or a plain navy or black coat. Coats should not have design features and should be appropriate for school. All seniors hang up their coats in school and I suggest coats should be practical and not expensive.

Cold weather accessories: in the juniors, the school woollen hat and scarf available from the uniform suppliers should be worn. In the seniors, a plain black or navy scarf or gloves are to be worn. No pupils should wear coloured or patterned hats, gloves or scarves. Please be aware that seniors will have non-uniform items confiscated and these will need to be collected from the school office.

Boots are not a part of school uniform in any part of the school, including the Early Years classes, so please make sure that pupils have sturdy black school shoes through the winter. If it snows, pupils may wear boots to and from school, but will need to wear shoes on site and in the buildings.

### **Year 11 Mocks**

GCSE Mock Exams for year 11 begin on Monday 30 November. These will take place at school and at the Masonic Hall on Station Road. I am pleased to hear that pupils have been working hard over half term at the school booster classes. These have been important preparations and I have been proud to see the pupils so committed towards their studies.

### **Website Recordings**

Our Virtual Open Days and Harvest Festival recordings and much more are now available for parents to see on the school website. I am incredibly proud of our pupils and staff as once again they continue to be the fantastic ambassadors for the school.

### **Armistice Day and the Poppy Appeal**

Every year in school we remember those who have died in wars by supporting the Poppy Day Appeal. Remembrance poppies will be available from Thursday 5 November at the front of the school in the morning. Please feel free to make a donation. We will have a minute's silence on Wednesday 11 November in classrooms to remember.

## Seesaw

We are introducing the Seesaw learning platform for Years 1-6 this term. This will eventually replace Show My Homework for Juniors. Parents will receive a letter about Seesaw and a log-in next week. Staff have a training session on Wednesday 11 November, after which we will trial the new platform with pupils and parents.

Seesaw provides more opportunities for teachers of younger pupils to provide child-friendly tasks and feedback, which we see as enhancing the programme we offered during the last lockdown.

The aim is that teachers will move across to use Seesaw for setting homework, and they will also use Seesaw in the case of any bubble isolations, or for the setting and return of work if there is a wider closure of schools by the Government again this year.

Please look out for the imminent information email, if you are a parent of a pupil in Year 1 to Year 6.
