Re: July 2021 Headmistress's Letter

This year has definitely provided us all with challenges, whether be they academic, pastoral or personal. It has been a reminder to us all to make every day count. Our pupils, their resilience, positivity and gratitude make the final stages of this busy term all the more worth it. As we reach the final stages of this term, we are once again at the mercy of the British weather. Nevertheless, the pupils have much enjoyed the build up to performances, workshops and we are all very much looking forward seeing parents at this year's sports day.

ISA Success

A number of pupils entered the ISA Shakespeare Competition earlier on this year. Nicolas in Year 6 recorded a 'Shakespearean rap' and achieved Highly Commended in the Key Stage 2 category. Congratulations to Nicolas for being recognised in this national competition in which there were over 600 entries from ISA schools.

Bikeability

Congratulations to our pupils in Years 5 and 6 who have completed their Bikeability Road Safety Training. It is reassuring to know that they have increased their road safety knowledge, riding confidence and know how to keep themselves safe on the roads. This also helps us move closer towards achieving the gold TFL accreditation.

Pupil Voice

Empowering our pupils to use their voices is something we actively encourage. Pupils are proactive in making suggestions directly to teachers, via the suggestion boxes or in School Council meetings. The pupils have already been successful in suggesting dishes to improve the school menu, suggesting the inclusion of plain navy leggings to be worn with the PE skort as an option and asking us to create spaces for them to grow their own plants on site, for which the Year 6 Prefects are currently responsible.

Earrings

This year, the senior pupils have asked the school to re-consider the rule regarding wearing earrings to school. The pupils have presented themselves very well and communicated effectively their request for change. As a result, there has been a review of the earring policy across the Oak-Tree Group.

We have decided that Pupils in Year 5 upwards may wear one plain gold or silver stud in each ear lobe from September 2021. The pupils must be able to manage taking their earrings in and out independently and be able to take full responsibility for them. Pupils will be wholly responsible for any earrings brought into school.

No other year groups will be allowed to wear earrings in school, in line with guidance provided by the Borough's Health & Safety Team. There used to be a practice of taping over earring during activities, but this was withdrawn recently. Tape should no longer be used to cover earrings.

May I therefore encourage any families who are considering ear piercing to use the long summer holiday so that ears are pierced early enough to allow the earrings to be removed by the time we return to school in September and to give time for the children to become used to taking their earrings in and out.

Earrings should not be worn to school on PE days.

PE Kits

The current arrangement of wearing PE kit for the whole day when there is a timetabled PE or Games lesson has been very successful. We are, therefore, planning to continue with it in the Autumn Term reviewing again before Christmas. Pupils, parents and staff have found the current arrangement of removing the need to change into PE kit has given more curriculum time to the PE lessons and reduced the amount of lost property and mislaid kit. May I remind senior pupils to bring deodorant wipes or sticks (not aerosols) into school on PE days to support personal hygiene.

The Playground

The junior pupils have been working together with the Heads of Houses to redesign the line designs in the playground. They explained their ideas clearly to the designers who have now presented their plans. I am delighted to say that the NSPA have been equally impressed and have agreed to fund the playground lines project. This work will take place in the summer holidays and I look forward to sending out photos of the finished product.

I continue to be amazed at how convincing our pupils can be when making suggestions for school improvement, conducting research to support their proposals and strategically formulating their arguments. Well done to all the pupils involved, clearly leaders of the future. Once again we are incredibly grateful to the NSPA for their ongoing support and commitment to school projects and ideas.

Pencil Cases in the Juniors

Pupils may bring their own small, plain pencil case into school from Year 3 upwards. The pencil case should fit easily into their school bag and be without any embellishments. Once a pupil has received their pen licence, we ask parents to buy Frixion blue erasable pens for their children to use in school. These pens are inexpensive and widely available online and in store.

Pupils might also like to have pencils, colouring pencils, a small ruler, eraser or highlighter. Pupils should not bring mathematical equipment including pairs of compasses into school and pointed scissors.

Information for Parents

Parents will be receiving the updated Parents' Handbook towards the end of the summer holiday, ready for the start of term in September. Parents will also receive a copy of their children's timetable for the new year.
