






JUNIOR NEWS

As part of STEM fortnight, pupils in Early Years to Year 6 took part in a problem solving experience and had to use their Mathematical skills to help them find the answers. Pupils enjoyed working collaboratively and using reasoning skills to solve the riddles. Well done to all the pupils who solved the riddles and puzzles - they were very tricky!











SENIOR NEWS - Science

Year 7 have been learning about the musculoskeletal system in Biology and Neutralisation in Chemistry in the spring term. Here are some snapshots of all the fantastic work they have been doing in Science.

Do try this at home: The <u>'Virutali-</u> <u>Tee'</u> is a fantastic way to explore basic human anatomy with your





child. Our homes are filled with acids and bases. You do not need laboratory equipment to figure out what sort of chemical is in your laundry detergent, all you need is a red cabbage! This website gives you further information.





Year 8 have been learning about the respiratory and digestive systems in Biology, the reactions of metals and non-metals in Chemistry and all about electromagnets in Physics this term. Here are some snapshots of all the fantastic work they have been doing in Science.

Do try this at home: Watch this <u>lecture</u> about the 'Chemistry of Fireworks' to learn about chemical reactions. The 'Get body Smart' website provides a lot of easy to access information about human anatomy and organisation.

The **Year 9** pupils have begun their GCSE course learning about the building blocks of matter and life. This term, they began learning about energy in Physics, went on the study Cell division in Biology and finally ended the term learning about the Periodic Table in Chemistry .

Do try this at home: This lecture and demonstration about <u>'Investigating</u> the periodic table with experiments' is an excellent watch.







Year 10 have had a busy term and are now well into their GCSE Course. Some highlights this term included learning about Reactions in Chemistry, where the pupils followed several complex methods independently and dissected an eyeball during their Triple Science lessons.

Do try this at home: The pupils will have their first taste of GCSE examinations when they sit their end of year examinations next term; these videos about 'Revision in y13 vs y10' and 'How to best choose your A level Subjects' are good starting points to begin to consider the next steps in Year 11 and beyond.

SENIOR NEWS - Science continued

Year 11 have now reached the end of their Normanhurst Science journey and are gearing up for their GCSE examinations. They did have some fun in the laboratory learning about waves and on their GCSE Biology Fieldtrip to the Epping Forest Field Studies Council.

Do try this at home: This exam survival guide is an excellent resource to help your children prepare for the upcoming examinations.







RSC Funded KS2 Teacher training event



This was an opportunity for Years 5 and 6 teachers from feeder schools to liaise with the Science department at Normanhurst School to help ease student's transition from primary to secondary school. It was a lively and informative evening with all the teachers being incredibly passionate about teaching Science and making it accessible and practical to all students. Principal issues addressed ranged from 'what an ideal Year 7 Science student would be' to 'common Science misconceptions' and 'how to ensure curriculum continuity'. The teachers were introduced to the activities demonstrated in the Science assembly and other curriculum linked resources.

Y7&8 Shakespeare Show - Midsummer Night's Dream by Anthony Glenn

On 27 March, Anthony Glenn's Shaking Up Shakespeare theatre company visited the school and produced a fabulous one man performance of 'A Midsummer Night's Dream to Years 7 and 8. This included extracts from Shakespeare's original play, along with some improvisation and audience participation. The pupils were enthusiastic participants and they had a wonderful experience. Since both year groups had studied 'A Midsummer Night's Dream, this really helped them understand the play and see it brought to life. Our aim at Normanhurst is to develop a love and passion for the works of Shakespeare and Anthony's performance really helped to encourage this.





JUNIOR TRIPS
