Harvest Festival Tuesday 3 October

Diversity Black History Month, Dyslexia Awareness Month and Diwali

In October we begin to celebrate Black History Month and pupils will have a variety of lessons across the school learning about some of the many significant black people in history and in modern day. Pupils will also celebrate Dyslexia Awareness Day on Monday 2 October by wearing something red with their uniform and donating money to the British Dyslexia Association. The pupils will learn about the many attributes of dyslexia and participate in circle times, poetry readings, role play and solving riddles. The newsletter and our social media pages will celebrate the pupils' learning as part of their understanding of diversity and inclusion. Pupils will also be learning about Diwali this month in preparation the Festival of Light celebrations on Sunday 12 November. Pupils will be participating in a number of activities to celebrate the event.

Revision and Positive Study Habit Workshops

We are pleased to host study and revision workshops for the senior pupils. This has been supported by the NSPA, who have subsidised the costs per pupil. On Thursday 11 January, there will be a series of workshops.

Years 7 and 8 - Exam Busters Workshop aims to empower pupils with exam preparation tips, revision tools and stress management techniques. It includes:

- Stimulating a positive attitude towards learning, revision and exams
- Upskilling pupils with effective memory techniques
- Providing a comprehensive exam tool kit

Years 9 and 10 - The Super Speed Study Skills workshop is an effective, immersive workshop that aims to inspire pupils to take control of their studying. It includes:

- How to maintain motivation when studying
- To raise standards of learning and cognition
- To encourage the adoption of a range of learning techniques

Year 11 – Mind Mapping which is designed to help pupils better organise their thoughts, allowing pupils:

- To show them how to make and take mind mapped notes
- To boost understanding and recall
- To encourage creativity and build excellent planning skills

These workshops will provide some excellent additional tools to their skillset and revision techniques to add to our pupils' exam repertoires. Further details will be shared shortly.

Online Safety

Each year we continue our partnership and commitment with parents to safeguard our pupils and children online.

Each term through the curriculum and engagement in activities and discussion, we will refresh and upskill our pupils knowledge and behaviour of being online and engaging in social media. Recently, friend-finding and social networking apps Wizz and HiPal Walkie Talkie have become increasingly popular amongst young people.

Wizz tries to encourage a positive environment and claims anyone violating their guidelines will be banned. But unfortunately, harmful content can easily be found. Users can expect content including profanity, sexual content, violence, substance content, and much more.

HiPal Walkie Talkie is a free online social networking app that allows users to talk to others using their phone as a 'walkie talkie' style device. It works even when a user's phone is locked and not in use.

Upon sign-up, users indicate whether they are either 12 or over, or under 12-years-old. The features do change slightly depending on which of these age categories a user falls into.

These apps are 'dating apps' for young people as young as 12 and 13, but it is a known that adults are able to register and are using this platform to make contact with children. There are some helpful links below.

Christmas Child Shoe Box Appeal

Every year as a school we make an amazing effort to support the work of Operation Christmas Child by filling shoe boxes with gifts to send to children overseas in need of support. The charity brings joy to many children and young people in significant need. This year we are having a Shoe Box House Challenge once again to see which house can donate the most boxes in the juniors and seniors. The deadline for these boxes is Friday 17 November, We aim to send at least 75 boxes and your help will be much appreciated. Please look out for the information leaflets when they come home. Half term is a good time to collect items for a shoebox, ready to bring into school after the holiday.

Last year we were fortunate enough to be able to volunteer to pack the shoe boxes in the warehouse. I know that the year 7 pupils really enjoyed doing so and developed a better understanding of the process from creating a box, checking each box to packing these for shipping. This year, Year 9 will have the opportunity to do this in the second half of the Autumn term in Tonbridge.

As requested at the start of term, please access your Parent Portal for ongoing information and to update any details that may have changed. This includes contact details (we need at least two current emergency contacts) and medical information. We upload key information to the Portal so that it can be accessed at your convenience.

Uniform Reminders

Please remember that pupils come back to school in winter uniform after the half term break. I would like to provide some important clarity regarding socks and tights.

- As part of the summer uniform, pupils are permitted to wear White ankle or knee length socks (White cotton tights permissible in inclement weather).
- The winter uniform for girls states they should wear Navy knee length socks or opaque navy tights.

The full uniform list can be found through the link: <u>www.normanhurstsch.co.uk/parents-pupils/school-uniform/</u> Junior pupils should all wear the regulation school coat, scarf and winter hat. From Year 7 upwards pupils may wear either the regulation coat, or a plain navy or black coat, without any logos or decoration. Pupils are only allowed to wear plain navy or black scarves, hats and gloves. Please can I remind parents and pupils that hair should be neatly cut for school, or tied back if long. It isn't suitable to have long hair over the eyes in school. All long hair must be secured in a hair band throughout the day.

Can I also kindly remind parents that earrings are only allowed to be worn by pupils from Year 5 upwards. Earrings should be plain round gold or silver studs, and must not be worn on PE days.

Mild Illness and School Attendance

The Government has published some guidance for parents about school attendance if their children are slightly unwell, which is based on advice from Professor Chris Whitty, the Chief Medical Officer, as well as other eminent medical professionals.

The guidance says that it is usually appropriate for parents and carers to send their children to school with mild respiratory illnesses. This would include general cold symptoms: a minor cough, runny nose or sore throat. However, children should not be sent to school if they have a temperature of 38°C or above.

The guidance also offers advice for parents whose children may feel anxious about coming to school: guidance on mental health issues affecting a pupil's attendance.
